80-year-old parishioners are needed, as well as 20-year-old parishioners. Please do not ignore this calling!

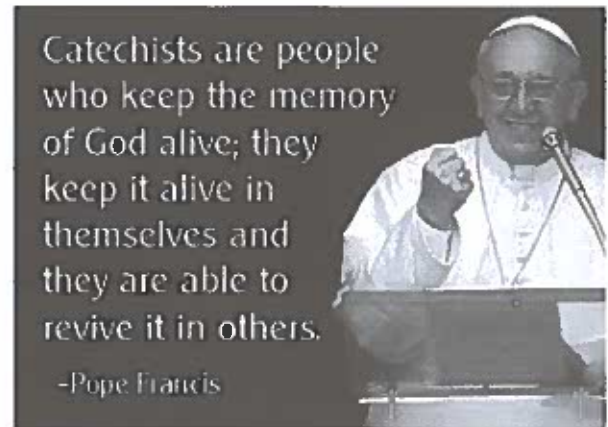
If you believe you do not know Catholicism well enough, do not let that stop you. A good Catholic never stops learning.
